When she got to the scene, she met the driver of one of the vehicles involved in the accident. The woman said she was sitting in her car waiting for her daughter when she was struck by another vehicle which then attempted to leave.

She said she ran after the other vehicle and watched as it reversed, almost hitting two other people before stopping.

Martinez then talked to the other driver , identified as Jade Dennison, 36, of Navajo, N.M. Dennison was talking on her cell phone trying to get her insurance information. Martinez also noticed she was holding onto the door of her vehicle for support.

Martinez asked Dennison why was trying to leave the scene of the accident and Dennison said she was talking to her daughter and became distracted. At first she said she had not been drinking. But then admitted she had one shot of "Hot Damn"; about four hours before she started driving.
